## THE ANGUL LAWS REGULATION (REPEAL) ACT, 1967

[ Received the assent of the Governor on the 28th July 1967, first published in an extraordinary issue of the Orissa Gazette, dated the 2nd August 1967 ]

AN ACT TO REPEAL THE ANGUL LAWS REGULATION, 1936 AND TO PROVIDE FOR MATTER CONNECTED THEREWITH OR INCIDENTAL THERETO

**B**E it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Orissa in the Eighteenth Year of the Republic of India, as follows :—

\*1. (1) This Act may be called the Angul Laws Regulation (Repeal) Act, 1967.

(2) This section shall come into force at once and the remaining provisions of this Act shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification, appoint in that behalf.

2. The Angul Laws Regulation, 1936 is hereby repealed.

3. For removal of doubts it is hereby declared that notwithstanding the repeal of the said Regulation all enactments specified in the Schedule thereto, which were in force immediately prior to the commencement of this Act in the areas comprising the district as defined in the said Regulation, shall continue in force in the said areas until altered or repealed or amended by a competent legislature or other competent authority.

4. In section 3 of the Orissa Revenue Administration (Units) Act, 1963 for the proviso to clause (b) the following proviso shall be substituted, namely :—

“Provided that the district, as defined in the Kandhmals Laws Regulation, 1936, shall be deemed to be a district for purposes of this Act.”
